Dear Friends,

I mentioned to a neighbor recently that it felt like a day with a to-do list a mile long. He replied, "I don't know a day that is not like that!" Hmm, the never-ending to-do lists... I remember the little book by Richard Carlson, Don't Sweat the Small Stuff. Your inbox will never be empty was a memorable title of one chapter; the implication was clear, that sometimes we just have to put aside the checklists. In the Judeo-Christian tradition we call this "keeping the Sabbath."

UCC pastors love the writings of our own, and Rev. Donna Schaper is quoted often, such as words from a book called Keeping Sabbath. She recalls a Hebrew scripture in Numbers Chapter 15 that gives a punishment of stoning someone caught gathering wood on the Sabbath. She interprets this text for our day as follows: "In our own day, we would never stone anyone for violating the Sabbath because we would not have to. Our own violations of the Sabbath - our Sunday soccer games, our wide open malls, our unwillingness to rest, to stop, to give it a break, we stone ourselves daily. It may not look like stoning, but ask almost anyone you know about their spiritual condition and they will tell you, "Exhausted bombarded, under the gun, burned out!"

Well, that is our condition. We fail to keep a Sabbath day in most of our weeks. We have a hard time taking Sabbath rest for even half a day a week.

Spiritual writers often speak of keeping empty places in our lives, unscheduled time, time with no agendas. Well, it seems that Summertime gives us the opportunity to take the commandment to "Remember the Sabbath and keep it holy" more seriously. As we plan some vacation time this summer, perhaps we can "plan" for some days that have no plans, or certainly no stressful work. Christians do not follow the "no work" rules rigidly, nor spend much time defining what constitutes work, but we could do well to try this lifestyle of our Jewish neighbors. If we want to go on a picnic with friends and family, we could do the preparation the day or eve before, so that the actual picnic day is more carefree. I find this a challenge indeed, as most of the time I can be found working right up to deadlines, doing last minute things.

So for all of us, let us keep the Sabbath this summer. Let Summertime *be* a Sabbath, with extra time to lounge around with a good book, time to take walks and bike rides in beautiful places, time to have longer phone calls or linger over meals with loved ones. That inbox *will* never be empty and the to-do list never be done. But we can give it a break, rest for awhile, and surely come back to it with greater energy and creativity for having remembered Sabbath time.
