Dear Friends,

Have you heard the news..... no not bombings in Syria, no, not bombings in Boston, no, I'm thinking about the news that people affiliated with religious organizations are not the MINORITY in America, just under 50% now. And if you add the phrase "who attend regularly," stats appear to say it is less than 25% of the American People..... and many say that in Massachusetts, we are on the lower end of the average, probably only 10-15% of us attending worship or prayer services regularly. Wow. There seems to be a small bubble of increase after events like the Boston Bombing. Perhaps it has to do with the saying "no atheists in foxholes," or just the common need to gather together as community to help each other heal and do whatever we can so that these things don't happen again.

I like the latter idea..... that now, more than ever, we can see the need for peacemaking in this world, for creating communities that make peace, that truly follow the golden rule. Many argue that religions are causing the violence in the world, but from what I can gather, it seems to be only an extremist wing of any religion that promotes violence to solve conflicts. It is all the more urgent for those of us who follow in Christ's way to insist that his way is centered in inclusive love!

Which brings up the big news of this week that an NBA ballplayer just came out as gay, reportedly the first pro ball player; initially all I heard was positive and supportive comments. But I did just read of one retired NBA player who tweeted support, and then was promptly "disinvited" from a speaking engagement at some church, on the basis of its moral code. After all the goodness seen in gay leaders in every field of endeavor, how can anyone still insist that same sex relationships are a moral failing and sin? Bible interpretation may be one reason. So my next question is how can anyone still take the Bible as literally prescriptive for every generation? I suppose an extremist or fundamentalist Christian group may do so. The Bible, in most of our understanding, is a "guide" that has obvious historical and cultural conditioning. One has only to look at issues regarding women and slaves to determine that. Jesus was reinterpreting scriptures of his day constantly as has the entire rabbinic tradition.

Was Jesus "soft on crime?" Was so tolerant that "anything goes?" Of course not. But let's be sure that things we call evil and fight against are truly harmful to the rest of society. "Who one loves" cannot be harmful to society, while forms of exploitative or abusive sexuality clearly are. How can tweeting support for someone's courage and honesty be harmful? But judging people as deficient for who they are, or excluding them from community surely can be.

So have you heard the news? Violence and discrimination are still alive and well in the world. Let us be part of the good news that says there is another way! There is the way of making peace, of dialogue rather than striking out with force. There is the way of including others who are different from us, withholding judgment, rather than judging others as wrong or sinful and then excluding them. Let us insist that the Good News in Jesus is always about healing, love, and reconciling people in beloved community. We may be a minority in our culture, even a small seed, but let's keep sowing and watering, trusting that God does give the growth.
