Dear Friends,

As we enter Fall, it is the time of the Jewish New Year, Rosh Hashanah, and the 10 days leading up to Yom Kippur, reminders and learning times for us all. We learn from our Jewish neighbors and from Jesus' own Jewishness. Jesus did not shy away from the reality of sin and evil. He even started his preaching days with words about repentance. Sure, we need not walk around riddled and shackled by guilt, but on the other hand a few reminders about working on ourselves can be helpful.

One of the key elements of Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, has become the initial Kol Nidre ceremony which has to do with release from vows or promises; it seems to be related to the Roman Catholic concept of annulment! While there are many fine points about sin and the breaking of vows, intentionally or unintentionally, etc., I come away with a simple lesson: We all break promises that we make; therefore we had best be careful what we promise, and be ready to forgive ourselves or others for broken promises.

Another key learning from the Kol Nidre ceremony is that we are all involved, interconnected, responsible in part for offenses happening around us (we are complicit at times by not saying anything). The confessional words are always in the first person plural, we. The forgiveness promised from God is also for not only the Israelites but for all strangers who live in their midst! The "Kol Nidre" has become a famous Cello solo, which starts in a minor key, sad in tone, to echo the woes and sins of the world and our complicity in them. The song ends in a major key, more hopeful in tone, seeming to echo the divine forgiveness that knows we cannot keep our vows to follow the ways of God. So we trust in a God whose promise to forgive IS always kept, always powerful to renew.

Doug Seegers, in our Oct 11 Roots Concert, will sing his famous song "Going Down to the River" what for? "To Wash My Soul Again" of course! Everywhere we go, we are reminded of our need to go to the waters of baptism, the waters of cleansing, and of the assurance that the Spirit of God is indeed constantly redeeming and renewing us! Happy Fall, Happy New Year..... See you at Belleville for our times of renewal!

Doug Seegers debut solo album entitled *Going Down to the River*, to be released on October 7, 2014, on Rounder Records, is raw, rootsy and emotionally charged. A brilliant 62 year old singer who struggled with homelessness for years, Seegers found acclaim when Swedish country music star, Jill Johnson, discovered him at "The Little Pantry That Could", a charity serving the hungry of West Nashville, Tennessee. Jill Johnson was doing a documentary about down-and-out musicians. Each week the pantry has a singer-songwriter night and it was there, that Jill Johnson discovered Doug Seegers. Jill had Doug record his song *Going Down to the River*. The song became an instant sensation when it was rolled out in Sweden, topping the iTunes chart. Seegers got a record deal in Sweden and embarked on a 60 gig tour in Sweden. Seegers has been #1 on the national album chart in Sweden.

Going Down to the River features collaborations with multi-Grammy winners Buddy Miller and Emmylou Harris, both of whom have championed the formerly down-and-out singer.

Emmylou states: "When I first heard his voice, so full of soul and raw emotion, I was stunned. This man has lived these songs, not in his imagination but every long day over many hard years. He stands before you now-ready to testify. Listen and believe."

This personal introspective album includes 10 Seegers originals and two covers, including a duet with Emmylou Harris. The CD examines the full gamut of emotions from lonely despair to exalted salvation and melds such diverse moods as a Texas swing dance floor gem ("*Hard Working Man*") to woe-is-me lament ("*Pour Me*") to shuffling honky-tonk ("*Baby Lost Her Way Home Again*").

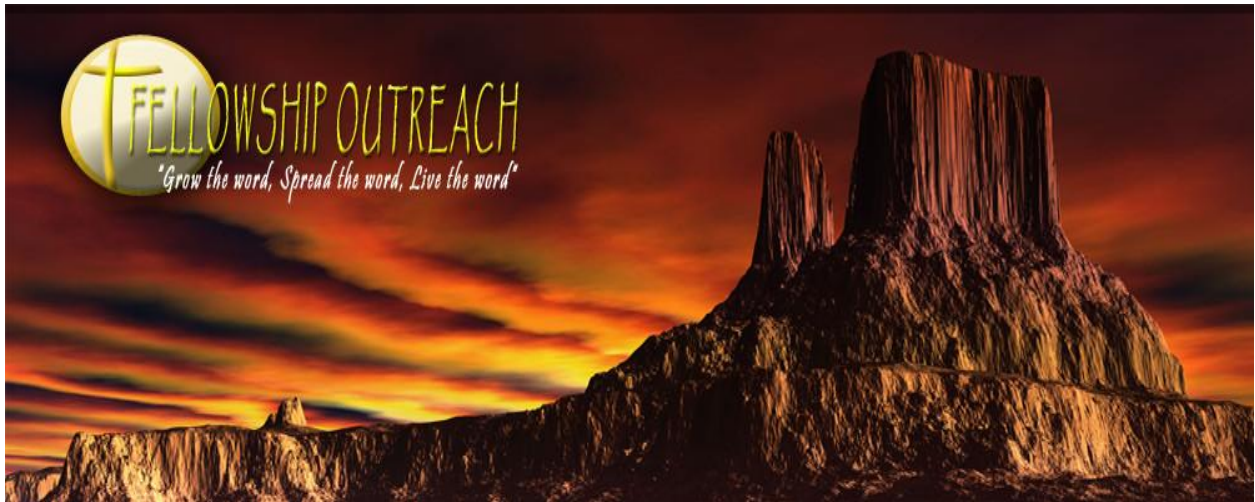

The October meeting of the Service Club will be held on Tuesday, October 14th at 1:30pm in the Bannister Room. All are welcome.



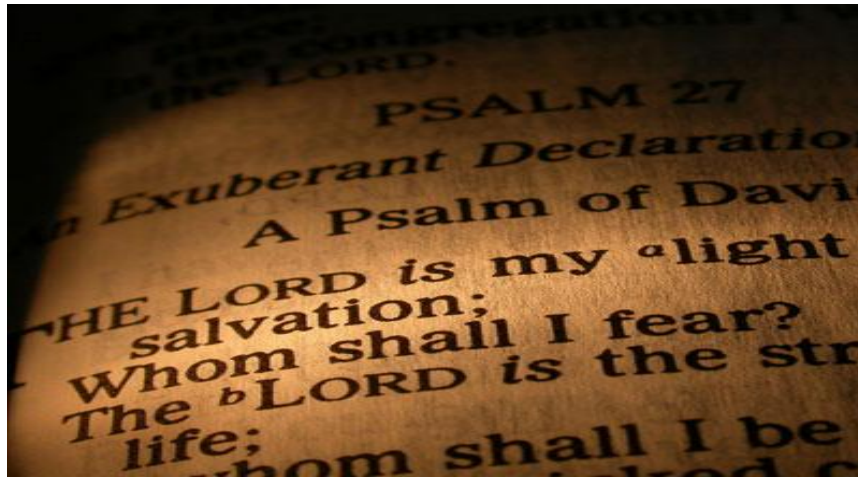
Fellowship / Outreach Board

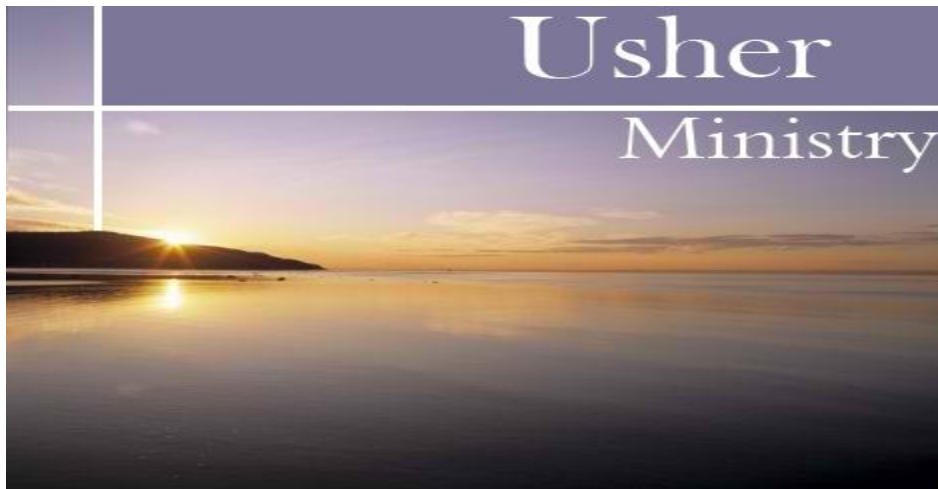
